The term "Pass the buck" meaning pass the responsibility to someone else originated from the game of poker. The marker or counter indicated the next person whose responsibility it was to deal. Should that person not want to deal, the player could pass the counter which became known as the buck to the next player.

President Truman coined the phrase "the buck stops here." He explained that as he was the President in charge of the country he had to often make tough decisions. Similarly the Worshipful Master of a lodge must make decisions. Often these are difficult and sometimes not popular.

You should check it periodically. This is the third symbolic working tool of a Worshipful Master.
